1. Rules Governing Academic Credit Exemption for 4-Year Technical School General Education English Curriculum (hereinafter as the “Rules”) are set forth in accordance with the NKUHT “Rules Governing Academic Credit Exemptions for Students” to help facilitate the General Education English curriculum credit exemption process.
2. Applicable Subjects and Standards
 - 2.1. Rules are applicable to 4-year Technical School freshmen at NKUHT; however, since Department of Applied English students are subject to independent curricula, they are not bound by the Rules hereunder.
 - 2.2. International students who meet the requirement shall take courses in accordance with the relevant Mandarin Language course rules of NKUHT.
 - 2.3. When applying for credit exemption, 4-year Technical School freshmen shall enclose a valid certificate of an English language competency test which meets CEFR B2 and is accredited by Ministry of Education or internationally recognized testing service and having been attained within the previous two years. The applicants may apply to exempt “English (Listening/Speaking) (1) (2 credits)”, “English (Listening/Speaking) (2) (2 credits)”, “English (Reading/Writing) (1) (2 credits)”, and “English (Reading/Writing) (2) (2 credits)”, 4 courses (8 credits) in total.
 - 2.4. Applicants who have attained academic diplomas or degrees from high school or above in an English-speaking country may apply for credit exemption.
 - 2.5. Applications will be assessed by the Language Center and exemptions will be granted once the applications have been approved.
 - 2.6. Pursuant to the Rules Governing Academic Credit Exemptions for Students, applicants applying to exempt General Education English credits are required to complete 8 credits of General Education courses for Juniors/Seniors to make up for the exempted General English credits.
3. 4-year Technical School freshmen applying for credit exemption shall apply to the NKUHT Language Center with an original copy and a duplicate photocopy of their supporting documents (test scores/diplomas) starting from the first day of classes of their first semester at NKUHT through the first week of their second semester at NKUHT. Having gathered the list of applicants, the Language Center will examine applicant eligibility and submit the list of eligible names to the Academic Affairs Office. Late applications will not be accepted.
4. The Rules shall be deemed in effect after the review and approval by a University Affairs meeting as well as the final approval by the President, and so shall any revision be thereafter.
